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2. PARTICIPATION

The UMF Ultramarathon Festival Venice is approved by the Italian Athletics Federation (FIDAL) and by IUTA; the event is included in the FIDAL National Calendar.

The race is also part of the 2026 IUTA National Ultramarathon Calendar.

The following participants are eligible to take part in the UMF Ultramarathon Festival Venice (6, 12, and 24-hour individual events):

A. Athletes Registered in Italy

According to the “Regulations for the Organization of Events” issued by FIDAL, athletes registered in Italy may participate, limited to individuals aged 20 and over (born on or before December 31, 2006), who meet one of the following requirements:

- Athletes in the Promesse, Senior, and Master categories registered with FIDAL for the current year (2026)
- Italian and foreign athletes registered with a Sports Promotion Body (for the Athletics discipline) that has a valid agreement with FIDAL, only if they hold a valid RUNCARD-EPS (with a non-expired validity date). The card must clearly state “Atletica Leggera” and the year 2026
- Holders of a RUNCARD. Italian and foreign citizens residing in Italy who are at least 20 years old (born on or before December 31, 2006) may participate even if they are not registered with a FIDAL-affiliated club, a foreign Athletics club affiliated with World Athletics (WA), or a Sports Promotion Body (Athletics discipline), provided they have a valid RUNCARD issued directly by FIDAL (info@runcard.com)

B. Athletes Registered Outside Italy

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Italian or foreign athletes not registered in Italy, aged 20 and over (born on or before December 31, 2006), may participate if they meet one of the following requirements:

- Athletes holding a Runcard (valid as sports insurance and competition permit), limited to individuals aged 20 and over (born on or before December 31, 2006). Participation is subject not only to possession of a valid RUNCARD, but also to the submission of a medical certificate of fitness for competitive athletics, valid at the time of the race. The certificate must be uploaded online and will be kept on file by the organizing club. The medical certificate for foreign athletes not residing in Italy may be issued in their home country, but must include the same examinations required by Italian law:
 - a) medical examination;
 - b) complete urine test;
 - c) resting and stress electrocardiogram;
 - d) spirometry

The Runcard is renewable, and its expiration date is printed on the card. If, on the day of the event, the card is found to be expired during verification, the athlete will not be allowed to participate, unless they present proof of online renewal.

- Athletes registered with a foreign Sports Promotion Body (Athletics discipline) affiliated with World Athletics (WA). Participation is subject to completing a declaration (provided by the Organizer during registration) stating the name of the Federation, the Club, and (if applicable) the membership number.

N.B.: All athletes must provide (exclusively via online upload) a medical certificate of competitive fitness bearing the wording “Athletics”.

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6-HOUR AND 24-HOUR RELAY RACES

The event also includes two relay races (**6-hour and 24-hour team events**), a recreational, non-competitive race open to all athletes holding a valid medical certificate of fitness for competitive athletics. FIDAL membership is **NOT** required.

TEAM FORMATION

Teams may be freely composed of men and women.

24-HOUR RACE: Each team must consist of a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 12 members.

6-HOUR RACE: Each team must consist of a minimum of 2 and a maximum of 3 members.

Each team must choose a name and appoint a Team Leader/Representative, who will be responsible for representing and coordinating the participants during the event, as well as for the accuracy of the information provided to the Organizers and for the single payment of the team's registration fee.

3. REGISTRATIONS

Individual registrations for the 6H, 12H, and 24H races must be completed directly online through the Timing Run | Dashboard at <https://www.timingrun.it/EventiTR/index.php> also accessible via the event's official website: <https://www.ultramarathonfestivalvenice.com>

For 6H and 24H relay race registrations, the team leader simply needs to send an email to info@ultramarathonfestivalvenice.com with the subject line "UMF STAFFETTA 6H" or "UMF STAFFETTA 24H", depending on the chosen event. The email will serve as an expression of interest, after which all the necessary information to finalize the registration will be provided.

3.1 Documents Required for Registration

A. For individual races (6-hour, 12-hour, and 24-hour)

- Copy of the valid FIDAL electronic membership card (valid on the day of the race)
- Copy of a valid medical certificate of fitness for competitive athletics (valid at the time of the event)

B. For relay races (6-hour and 24-hour team events)

- Copy of the valid medical certificate of fitness for competitive athletics for each team member, to be submitted **ONLY** at the time of bib collection.

€ 300,00 (until March 31, 2026)

REGISTRATION FEE REFUND POLICY

In the event of serious injury or illness, certified by a medical report, cancellation must be communicated via email — attaching the medical certificate or report — to the Organization at info@ultramarathonfestivalvenice.com at least 15 days before the event (by March 28, 2026). In this case, a 50% refund of the registration fee will be granted.

Cancellation for any other reason does not entitle the participant to a refund, but it is possible to transfer the bib number to another runner, with any necessary adjustment to the registration fee at the time of transfer. The substitution process will be handled exclusively by the Organization, and the communication must be sent to info@ultramarathonfestivalvenice.com at least 30 days before the event (by March 11, 2026).

Postponement of the registration to the following edition is not permitted.

IMPORTANT: In the event of race cancellation or interruption due to weather conditions, force majeure, legal orders from competent authorities, or any other circumstances beyond the Organization's control, no refund will be issued.

The Organizing Committee reserves the right to modify these regulations at any time for reasons it deems appropriate and/or to ensure better race organization, after notifying and obtaining approval from FIDAL and IUTA.

5. MICROCHIP

Provided by the Organization, individual and single-use, for the individual time-based races (6-hour, 12-hour, and 24-hour).

For the 6-hour and 24-hour relay races, the single-use chip will be delivered together with the bib number and bib holder — all of which (chip + bib + bib holder) will constitute the team's BATON. Please note that the race kit must be collected by the team representative designated during registration.

6. EVENT LOCATION

All races will take place inside Parco San Giuliano (Venice), on a closed, traffic-free asphalt circuit, completely flat (zero elevation gain) and fast. The running direction will always be counterclockwise.

COURSE CERTIFICATION

The **1,382-meter race course** has been measured and certified by FIDAL, both nationally and internationally.

7. INFORMATION ABOUT PARCO SAN GIULIANO

Parco San Giuliano, designed by architect Antonio Di Mambro, was inaugurated in 2004.

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Covering an area of 74 hectares, it represents one of the most ambitious urban redevelopment projects in Italy and is a large urban park located entirely within the Municipality of Venice.

Overlooking the Venetian Lagoon near the entrance to the Ponte della Libertà from the mainland and not far from Marco Polo International Airport, the park is not only an area of environmental and landscape restoration but also an ideal venue for sports and cultural activities.

7.1 HOW TO GET THERE

The GPS coordinates for reaching Parco San Giuliano are:

45° 28.54 N – 12° 16.06 E

>> BY PLANE

From Venice Marco Polo Airport (approx. 10 km away), take bus no. 5 towards Venezia and get off at the stop Parco San Giuliano.

>> BY CAR

FROM PADUA

From the Venice motorway exit, keep right and take the exit toward Venezia/Ravenna/Mestre/Marghera. Continue straight and at the roundabout take the 2nd exit following the signs for Porto/Trieste/Belluno/Tarvisio/Venezia. Follow directions toward Venezia.

Continue along SS11 toward Venezia, then keep left toward Ravenna/Padova. After merging into the right lane, follow the exit for Treviso/Trieste/Airport and turn right after the overpass. Continue for about 1 km until the first parking lot on the left.

FROM TREVISO / BELLUNO / UDINE / TRIESTE

From the Venice motorway exit, keep left and proceed toward the Mestre bypass (Tangenziale di Mestre) following the signs for Venezia/Airport. After about 8 km, take the SS13 exit toward Venezia/Treviso/Triestina. At the roundabout, take the 3rd exit onto SS13/SS14bis – Via Martiri della Libertà.- Continue along SS13/SS14bis for about 6 km toward Venezia until you reach Parco San Giuliano.

>> BY BUS

From Venice – Piazzale Roma:

ACTV lines 5, 12, 12/, 19, 24, 24H, N1 stop near Parco San Giuliano

From Mestre – City Center:

ACTV lines 10, 12, 12/, 12L, 29 (get off at the last stop on Viale S. Marco)

From Mestre FS – Train Station:

ACTV lines 9, 40 (get off at the last stop on Via Forte Marghera), then walk toward Viale S. Marco.

ACTV line 31 (last stop on Viale S. Marco)

>> BY TRAIN

Mestre FS Railway Station is about 4 km from Parco San Giuliano.

From Mestre FS – Train Station:

ACTV lines 9, 40 (get off at the last stop on Via Forte Marghera), then walk toward Viale S. Marco.

ACTV line 31 (last stop on Viale S. Marco).

From Venice Santa Lucia Station, by vaporetto (waterbus):

ACTV line 21 (formerly line 25) connects Parco San Giuliano with Venice historic center, with stops at “S. Giuliano – Fondamenta Nove – Ospedale” and “Ospedale – Fondamenta Nove – S. Giuliano”.

9. RACE PACK COLLECTION

At the race venue, inside Parco San Giuliano, participants may collect their race pack at the Organizational Secretariat, following the schedule and times listed above:

For the **6-HOUR, 12-HOUR, and 24-HOUR** races

- 1 Data and time tracking microchip with user instructions
- Race bib
- Safety pins
- Informational leaflet
- Event technical shirt
- Event gadgets (depending on the chosen race)

Important information:

- The chip must not be exchanged with other participants and cannot be reused in other races. **It does not need to be returned at the end of the event.**

For the **6-HOUR and 24-HOUR RELAY RACES**

- 1 Microchip for timing and data processing with usage instructions
- Bib holder + race bib, which together serve as the **BATON**
- Event technical shirt for each team member
- Participation medal for each team member
- Event gadgets

Important information:

- The race kit must be collected by the team representative designated during registration.

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- The chip, delivered together with the bib and bib holder (the **BATON**), must be passed between teammates during relay exchanges.
- The chip cannot be reused in other races and does not need to be returned at the end of the event
- The first runner of each team will start at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 11, 2026.
- The relay exchange will take place as follows:
Each team must announce their next runner by minute 55 of every hour. This is done by having the incoming runner enter the designated relay exchange area. At the start of the new hour, the race director will signal the beginning of the exchange, after which the handover must occur at the first available pass within the designated and marked exchange zone, through a hand touch and baton exchange.
- A basic refreshment station will be available in the exchange area for runners who have just completed their leg.

Note: The exchange is permitted only after the end of each hour. However, a runner may continue and run multiple consecutive hours if desired.

10. RESULTS, MEASUREMENT, AND UPDATES

Each athlete will be equipped with an electronic microchip that allows for precise lap timing along the course. This timing will be verified by FIDAL's Race Judges (GGG) for individual competitive events only. For each athlete, the number of complete laps covered will be recorded, along with the partial distance of any unfinished lap being completed when their race time expires. To enable this measurement, 30 minutes before the end of each race, athletes will receive a numbered marker, which must be placed on the ground at the exact point reached on the circuit when the 6th, 12th, or 24th hour is completed (a sound signal will indicate the end of the respective time period). This process will be carried out under the strict supervision of the Race Judges. The total distance will be rounded down to the nearest full meter. As required by FIDAL / IUTA Ultramarathon regulations, only results exceeding 42.195 km will be included in the official rankings.

A results board showing partial race updates will be available at the Organizational Secretariat and at the refreshment area located in the Neutralization Zone.

11. SERVICES DURING THE RACE

- **Neutralization Zone:** a designated area approximately 200 meters long, located along the course near the start/finish arch — this is the only area where athletes may receive personal assistance.
- Toilets located along the race route.
- Full refreshment station provided by the Organization (at the start area).
- Water station provided by the Organization (mid-course).
- Water station reserved for RELAY TEAMS: in the relay exchange zone, a basic refreshment station will be available exclusively for runners who have completed their leg.
- Area with tables provided by the Organization for personal refreshments and possible rest stops, available to athletes and assistants without tents (see paragraph 12).
- Medical assistance service and mobile first-aid support equipped with a defibrillator.
- Sports massage service.

Note :

The Organization declines any responsibility for potential consequences arising from the consumption of food and beverages provided during the race. Each participant is responsible for their own nutrition and for consuming distributed products, taking into account any allergies, intolerances, or personal health conditions. By registering for the race, the participant expressly releases the Organization, its staff, and suppliers from any direct or indirect liability for damages that may result from the ingestion of food or beverages provided during the event.

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12. PERSONAL REFRESHMENTS

In the Neutralization Area, near the refreshment station provided by the Organization, there will be a designated area with tables and benches available for athletes' personal food and drinks. Athletes may place their personal refreshments directly on these tables. Please note that it is strictly forbidden to take or receive personal food or beverages outside the Neutralization Area, except for the use of public fountains located along the course.

To ensure sufficient space for athletes participating in the individual time-based races (6-hour, 12-hour, and 24-hour), each relay team (6-hour and 24-hour relays) will be assigned one single station, identifiable by the team's own gazebo, placed in the positions designated by the Organization.

NEUTRALIZATION AREA

A dedicated and clearly marked fixed area will be established where athletes can access their personal refreshments. Each athlete must bring any additional items not specified here. It is recommended to bring a blanket in case of cold weather and any personal supplies or food deemed necessary.

13. OTHER RULES

- The chip must be worn before entering the start area (following the provided instructions). The chip must not be exchanged with other participants, cannot be reused in other races.
- Clothing must comply with the International Technical Regulations. A change of clothing during the race is permitted, but the bib number must remain clearly visible at all times.
- The Race Doctor is the only person authorized to enter the course in the event of an athlete's injury. The doctor will decide what treatment is necessary and may, if deemed appropriate, require the athlete to withdraw from the race.

- Any form of pacing or accompaniment is strictly prohibited, under penalty of disqualification.
- Assistants are not allowed to remain on the race circuit and may approach athletes only within the Neutralization Area, and only for the time necessary for refreshments, clothing changes, or other assistance-related tasks.
- Yielding is recommended in the event of overtaking: the inner lane of the circuit is reserved for faster athletes.
- During road races, the use of video recorders, radios, CD players, walkie-talkies, mobile phones, or similar devices is not prohibited (per WA rules), unless otherwise instructed by the Race Judges.
- Leaving the circuit is permitted only within the Neutralization Area (for refreshments, rest stops, or toilet use) and in the medical assistance area, provided it is reported to and authorized by the Judges.
- Rest breaks are allowed only in the designated area set up by the Organization, i.e., within the Neutralization Area.
- Leaving the circuit for any unauthorized reason will result in disqualification.
- Athletes are required to dispose of waste, cups, etc., in the bins provided. Leaving litter along the course will result in disqualification.
- For all matters not covered in this regulation, the FIDAL and IUTA Ultramarathon Rules shall apply.

14. PROCEDURES (ANTI-DOPING AND APPEALS)

14.1 Anti-doping

According to the regulations of World Athletics (WA), FIDAL, CONI, and WADA.

In accordance with an internal ethical code, the Organization reserves the right to evaluate the eligibility of athletes who, in the past, have received FIDAL reports or suspensions related to the use of doping substances.

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14.2 Appeals

Appeals must first be submitted verbally to the Referee of the Jury within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the race results. Second-level appeals must be submitted in writing to the Appeals Jury (using the form available at the Organizational Secretariat) within 30 minutes of the official announcement of the Referee's decision and must be accompanied by a federal fee of €100.00.

15. AWARDS

All participants will receive a race pack containing event gadgets. All classified athletes who reach a distance of **45.00 km** (in the individual competitive races only) will receive an Ultramarathon Finisher Medal.

RANKING AWARDS

For individual races (**6-HOUR, 12-HOUR, and 24-HOUR**):

WOMEN: Top 3 overall female athletes

MEN: Top 3 overall male athletes

CATEGORY PRIZES:

The top male and top female athlete in each FIDAL age category present in the race will be awarded.

The top three overall male and female finishers will not be included in the category awards.

For the **6-HOUR RELAY RACE**:

- Awards for the winning teams in the men's, women's, and mixed categories.

- Participation medal for all team members, regardless of distance covered or final result.

For the **24-HOUR RELAY RACE**:

- Awards for the top 3 teams overall.
Participation medal for all team members, regardless of distance covered or final result.

Additional prizes to be announced.

2. Our Privacy Policy

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Everyone has the right to the protection of their personal data. UMF VENICE TEAM ASD guarantees its users' right to be informed about the collection and other processing activities involving their personal data. In processing data that may directly or indirectly identify an individual, we adhere to the principle of strict necessity. For this reason, our web applications are designed, and our photographers are instructed, to operate according to this principle — minimizing the use of personal data and excluding its use whenever the same purpose can be achieved with anonymous data or by means that allow identification only when necessary or upon request from authorities or law enforcement. The organizers may transfer these usage rights to third parties, including their institutional and commercial partners, as provided in this paragraph.

4. Use of Personal Data and Purpose

The personal data of users (such as personal details, username and password, email address, and photographs taken during events organized by us) are collected and processed by UMF VENICE TEAM ASD for purposes strictly related to the use of its websites, applications, and informational or promotional communication services for the sporting events it organizes — including communications from third-party advertisers.

Personal data may also be used in other processing operations, provided that such processing remains compatible with these purposes. In particular, users' personal data may be processed for the following purposes:
